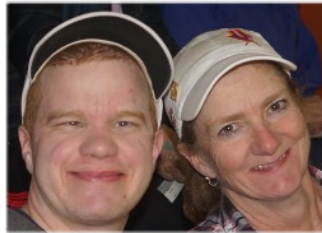

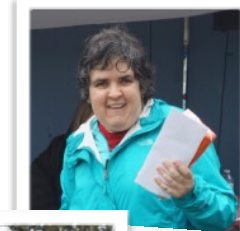
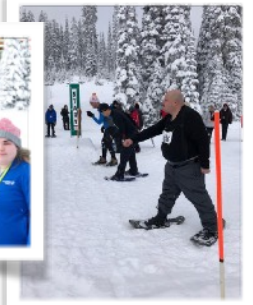
The West Van Run raised \$4,965.00!
